Police Recorded Crime Monthly Data

File format: CSV (comma separated)

Time period covered: from April 2001 (2001/02 financial year)

Data file updated on a quarterly basis with updates occurring by end:

- July (data to 30th June),
- October (data to 30th September),
- January (data to 31st December) and
- May (data to 31st March, completed financial year)

Revisions

Provisional in-year: changes to previously uploaded *Count* totals in the current financial year will occur each time the data is uploaded during that financial year.

Annual revisions may be made to completed financial years from 2015/16.

The individual series for domestic burglary and burglary-residential cannot be added together to create an overall figure.
